The older children had breakout sessions where they were able to ask questions to the high school students that were helping with the performance. This smaller group setting allowed for the children to feel more comfortable asking questions, along with more children getting to ask questions.

The group put on an energetic, engaging assembly for both sections. (K-3, and 4-5) All students were involved in singing, chanting, dancing and learning. The presenters were totally engaged and full of energy the entire performance.
